







COVID-19 SUNSHINE COAST EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTRE BULLETIN

April 8, 2020

This is the official communication for the Level 2 Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) for the Sunshine Coast Regional District, District of Sechelt, Sechelt Indian Government District and Town of Gibsons.

The following information is accurate as of the time of this bulletin.

Number of confirmed cases in BC: 1,291 confirmed cases as of April 7.

Number of cases in the Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH) region: 603 as of April 7.

Recent Updates

- New Transport Canada Screening Requirements at BC Ferries: For any route longer than 30 minutes, BC Ferries will screen all customers for COVID-19 symptoms and restrict travel to any customer that does not meet the screening requirements. Prior to boarding a BC Ferries ship, customers will need to answer questions to which they must answer truthfully. More details here.
- Transit Notice for Easter Weekend: Transit will be running on the SATURDAY SCHEDULE on Friday, April 10, Good Friday and Monday, April 13, Easter Monday. HandyDART will not be in service. - All Provincial Parks now closed: BC Parks is immediately closing all provincial parks in response to the widespread call for increased action to address COVID-19. News Release.

- Canadians returning home: The Government of Canada is advising that all Canadians
 and permanent residents returning to Canada will be screened for symptoms of COVID19 and must complete a contact form to help the Public Health Agency of Canada
 monitor and enforce the 14-day self-isolation requirement. News release here.
- FortisBC new financial support: FortisBC received interim approval from the BC Utilities Commission to implement its COVID-19 <u>Customer Recovery Fund</u>, a program that provides new support measures for residential and small business customers who are facing financial challenges as a result of the COVID-19 public health emergency. The Fund will be available to natural gas, propane and electric customers.
