





# PROJECT HISTORY



## **GLASSFORD ROAD**



- Local road designation
- Wide pavement width for two lanes, absence of sidewalks or curbs.
- Fronting a daycare and nursery, and home to families with small children



### **PROJECT HISTORY**

JULY 2020

 Petition presented to Council to consider traffic-calming measures for Glassford Road.

JUNE 2021

## Engagement Round 1

- 2 online community meetings and a community survey on a proposed trial closure of Glassford Road.
  - 126 survey responses, 68% in favour of a trial closure

# PROJECT HISTORY (CON'T)

JULY 2021

- Council passed a resolution to implement a temporary trial closure and collect data.
  - A pre-closure count was conducted at the beginning of August
  - Closure installed end of August, south of Blain Lane
  - Post-closure count conducted

JANUARY 2022

- Road Closure Results:
  - Traffic on Glassford fell by 66% (580 to 200 vpd)
  - Traffic on Gower Point Road increased by 17% (1430 to 1670 vpd)
  - Traffic on Dogwood increased by about 100% (90 to 180 vpd)
  - Traffic on Blain Lane significantly increased (10 to 70 vpd)
  - Blain Lane closure implemented in December 2021 due to increased traffic volumes.

Vpd = vehicles per day

# PROJECT HISTORY (CON'T)

MARCH 2022

#### Engagement Round 2

- Community survey about resident experience with the trial closure.
  - 74% of Glassford Road residents were in favour of the closure.
  - Many residents on adjacent areas were opposed to the closure, particularly residents on Gower Point Road.
- Decision to reopen Glassford was deferred until April 2022

MAY 2022  Town staff recommended to re-open Glassford Road with a 30km/h speed limit at the Committee of the Whole Meeting.

# PROJECT HISTORY (CON'T)

# JUNE 2022


- Following a presentation by a neighbourhood youth delegation, Council resolved that Glassford Road remain closed and that barricades be relocated to north of Blain Lane.
- Speed limit at surrounding roads was reduced to 30 km/hr.



#### Engagement Round 3

- Online community session:
  - Reviewed Active Transportation Improvements in Gibsons
  - Gathered feedback on potential traffic calming and active transportation changes for Gower Point Road and Glassford Road.

# PROPOSED CONCEPTS



## **DESIGN OPTION A: ROAD CLOSURE**

- Closure north of Blain Lane using breakaway posts
- 2 speed humps on Glassford Road near **Gower Point** Road









# **DESIGN OPTION B: TRAFFIC CALMING**

- 5 speed humps along Glassford Road
- Reduced speed limit to 30km/h
