- In 2018 Gibsons Rotary in collaboration with the Town of Gibsons and Longman Developments Ltd. completed Phase 1 of the Armours Beach Shoreline Improvement Project including washroom facilities, an accessible pathway, landscaping and picnic tables.
- Now Gibsons Rotary wants to build Phase 2 of the Armours Beach Improvement Project with a focus on marine park improvements.







Additional Design Elements

- Small slide
- Diving board
- Kayak / paddle board storage rack
- Sheltered beach area raked of rocks / imported sand





Community Benefits

- Sheltered safe space for moms & tots to swim
- Active outdoor summertime space for teens
- Easy marine access for adults and seniors to swim, launch paddle boards, kayaks, etc.

Environmentally Sensitive Design

 No marine micro plastics due to highdensity polyethylene (HDPE) pontoon construction (No Styrofoam!)

- Minimal eelgrass shading due to single dock design and no moorage
- No erosion or benthic impacts due to suspended "Eco-Mooring Lines" where concrete blocks are needed
